Origin of the Programme of Social Promotion for Gypsy People

In the very beginning of the eighties of the last century the Santa Casa da Misercórdia of Lisbon felt the necessity of creating a specific answer for the gypsy community of Lisbon, seeing that her members looked regularly for our services, nonetheless we did not have a profound knowledge of the specificities of this ethnic group. The answer we found was the Programme of Social Promotion for Gypsy People (PPSC) that has developped, during its existence, different work approaches in order to attend the expectations of this specific group.



Results of 2004


In 2004, 161 young people were registered, 75 of them continued their studies within the Programme, 21 joint enterprises, 8 received a certificate but did not find a job and 57 were offered new opportunities.







Number of Services to Families






Characterization of the Population in the School year 2005 - 2006 Distribution of the Trainees by Sex






Characterization of the Population in the School year 2005 – 2006 Distribution of the Trainees by Training Course
