- Need for a strategy for equality for Travellers in education that harnesses the efforts of all the actors- public authorities, the Traveller community and NGOs
- The Department of Education must take a lead role in developing such a strategy

**Equality Commission** 

FOR NORTHERN IRELAND

- There is a need for the Department, in consultation with other actors, to set clear targets for improvement that are realistic and achievable
- Immediate targets should focus on the requirements of the education legislation



- The target cohort must be all schoolage Traveller children plus children of pre-school age
- Need for constant interaction with Traveller parents
- Need for pre-service and in-service training for teachers



- Need for as multicultural approach including cross curricular appreciation of difference and tackling of racist bullying
- Need to disseminate best practice
- Nomadic Travellers must be facilitated with education services



- Monitoring role for the Equality Commission
- Need for action not just further discussion
- Next step is to get together actors at senior level – ECNI can facilitate












