## Introduction

The purpose of this guide is to promote teaching initiatives targeting youth to raise awareness of and engage in training on subjects relating to European citizenship: learn about how the genesis of what we know as Europe today, how the European Union emerged<sup>1</sup>, the enlargement process and related criteria, the institutions comprising the Union and how citizens can become involved and contribute to making Europe much more their own than it has been to date.
