It delivers projects and services to reduce social inequalities and to defend the rights of Roma people, mainly in the fields of employment, education and housing. Our work also aims to promote more active policies for the social inclusion of the Roma population, to fight discrimination and to achieve equality of opportunity in Spain and across Europe.

WE DELIVER PROGRAMMES AND **SERVICES TO DEFEND THE RIGHTS** OF ROMA PEOPLE

We want to be an engine of change, pushing for full citizenship for Roma people, reducing inequalities and guaranteeing their social advancement, defending their rights and promoting their social participation. 

WE CARRY OUT STUDIES THAT GUIDE PUBLIC POLICY

With our studies we reveal the inequality that Roma people experience, and thus drive measures and specially designed actions to revert it and to prevent the processes which cause it.

The segregation of Roma students at school, the evaluation of the impact of the Calí Programme, the characteristics and circumstances of the people who live in settlements, and the discrimination which the Roma community experiences were the main subjects of our reports in 2022.

WE DEFEND THE VICTIMS OF DISCRIMINATION AND WE COMBAT ANTGYPSYISM

En 2022 we renewed the coordination of the Support Service for victims of racial or ethnic discrimination, in collaboration with the CEDRE (Council for the Elimination of Racial or Ethnic Discrimination) and 7 other social organisations, and with an enlarged team.

PROMOCIONA: A METHODOLOGY WHICH BOOSTS LEVELS OF EDUCATIONAL SUCCESS

The main activity of *Promociona* is educational guidance for students and their families. This is complemented by group and socio-communitary activities, among which stand out the *Promociona Classrooms*, group guidance sessions and educational gatherings. We also include mentoring with companies as part of the vocational guidance, to strengthen educational continuity and success. Coordination with the students' centres of education is an essential part of the programme.

PROMOCIONA-T: SUPPORTING Promociona-T FROM THE FOUNDATION

With Promociona-T we reinforce the enrolment of Roma pupils in infant education, and from primary education we combat absenteeism, falling behind in studies and early school dropout. Educational support is the programme's main activity, complemented by educational guidance for students and their families, as a methodology of intervention which encourages implication, motivation and the improvement of expectations around educational pathways.

This Service is provided together with a further 7 organisations: ACCEM, CEAR, the Spanish Red Cross, Fundación Cepaim, MPDL, Red Acoge and Rumiñahui.

We are active in speaking up in Spain and Europe to achieve an impact on policies of inclusion



WE INFLUENCE THE POLITICAL AGENDA, IN SPAIN AND IN EUROPE, TO DEFEND THE RIGHTS OF ROMA PEOPLE

- We participate actively in the development of the National Strategy for the Roma Population, as a member of the State Council of the Roma people.
- With the Recovery, Transformation and Resilience Plan, we focus mainly on the areas of housing, eradicating slums, combating school failure, active employment policies and the digital agenda.



- We are part of various European Commission Advisory Groups (on the Roma population, on European Funds and on racism), as well as the EU High-Level Group to combat racism, xenophobia and other forms of intolerance.
- We contributed a proposal which was incorporated into the European Parliament Resolution of the 5th October 2022, about the circumstances of the Roma population who live in settlements in the EU, in which the European Commission is urged to put in place a European Plan of Action for the eradication of Roma settlements.
- We collaborate with various European institutions and organisations, including the European Parliament, the European Commission (DG Justice, DG Employment, Social Affairs and Inclusion, DG Regional Policy), the European Economic and Social Committee, the EU Fundamental Rights Agency (FRA), and international organisations such as the UN.

WE WORK IN PARTNERSHIP

We lead the European EURoma network which brings together the public authorities of 15 Member States and the European Commission to improve the use of European Cohesion Policy Funds in order to promote equality and inclusion for the Roma population.



- We participate in the Zero Child Poverty Country Alliance to eradicate child poverty.
- ▶ Together with the Spanish Committee of Representatives of Disabled People (CERMI) and Save the Children we created the Alliance for Inclusive Education and against School Segregation.
- We participate in the development and monitoring of the 2030 Agenda through the Platform Futuro en Común (Future in Common), a multi-sector platform which brings together more than 50 organisations and smaller platforms.



- With the Alliance for the Law on Equal Treatment we worked, along with another 13 NGOs, to improve the draft comprehensive law on equal treatment and nondiscrimination.
- We work to defend the economic, social and cultural rights of Roma people through the platform **DESC (ESCR) Spain**.
- We continued our participation in the project Find your way to the world of work, financed by EEA Norway Grants Fund for Youth Employment, with the aim of supporting vulnerable young people to improve their access to and graduation from secondary education.

We are also part of: The European Anti Poverty Network (EAPN); the Council for the Elimination of Racial or Ethnic Discrimination; State Council of NGOs for Social Action (POAS); Monitoring Committee for POISES (Operational Programme for Social Inclusion and Social Economy); Monitoring Committee for POEJ (Operational Programme for Youth Employment); Social Inclusion Network of Spain; Platform of Childhood Organisations (POI); EU Roma Coalition, with European-level Roma NGOs; Youth Council of Spain; Platform of the Third Sector (PTS); Platform of Volunteers in Spain (PVE); AEF (Spanish Association of Foundations); Group of Private Operations of the Operational Programme; FIARE – Ethical Banking.

WE SHARE OUR WORK AND EXPERIENCE, ALSO IN EUROPE

- We finalised our work at the European programme No-Segregation, for the identification of best practices in the fight against educational segregation, and also on the transference of the *Acceder* Programme to North Macedonia, hand in hand with the United Nations.
- We participate in the European Platform for the Inclusion of the Roma Population and in the organisation of the Roma Week in the European Parliament.





We are part of the coordinating team for the *European Roma Civil Monitor* 2021-2025 project aimed at providing training to NGOs in 27 countries in the monitoring of the National Strategies for Roma Equality, Inclusion and Participation.




